Eat this: Fried chicken flies high

OLDTOWN – The woman behind the counter has no delusions about why I am there, and the way her clipped tone smoothly slices through small talk is thrilling.

"What do you want?" she inquires, the shrewd look in her eyes informing you that she will not tolerate shenanigans.

"Two drumsticks, two thighs and a breast," I tell her.

With no hesitation, she begins deftly plucking pieces of fried chicken from the deli case; expertly digging through the crunchy, golden pieces in their warm, metal bed until she finds another drumstick. She seals the tender meat in a plastic bag with the quickness of a Macy's gift wrapper during last minute Christmas shopping and rings me up. I hand over the cash without hesitation. This is undoubtedly the best \$8 I will spend all day.

If taste buds could be used as a verb, it would apply to the description of this deli delight.

"It's just fried chicken," one might dismiss. To which I must ask, are you also the kind of person who says things like, "Seen one sunset, seen em' all"? Do you also think it's silly when adults dress up for Halloween, or that children believe in Santa Claus? Open your heart to the small wonders of the world, and your mouth to a finely seasoned drumstick.

I have asked the same woman before what the secret is to their chicken. How do they make it so lip smacking and flavorful every time, even the white meat? A special seasoning? Perhaps a blessing from the local bishop? She simply shrugs and gives me the only vague answer she has ever given me in our exchanges.

"It's just a simple coating that we use."

With all due respect, madam, I do not believe you. There is some Walter White, Breaking Bad kitchen magic afoot here, and while that particular story did not end well, even if I'm having a bad day, this succulently fried fowl is always a bright spot.

While I don't have the recipe for the above-mentioned deliciousness, I do have what I

think is a worthy offering. Childhood visits to my grandmother Sophie in the Tri-Cities always included a basket of her fried chicken when we went swimming at Hood Park or the water slides. I know, everyone thinks their grandma made the best this-and-that, and I'm not saying mine made the best fried chicken (she holds that title for banana bread). But this recipe is nothing to dismiss, and it's fairly easy to make. Plus if you feel like going the extra mile and making the accompanying gravy, settle your legal affairs for the upcoming food coma.

Crisp Chicken

Mix flour, salt, paprika and pepper. Dip chicken pieces into flour mixture, then buttermilk, and then back in the flour mixture. Fry in corn oil until golden, then place chicken pieces on paper-towel covered platter, allowing them drain off excess oil. Put chicken on oven pan and bake for 30-minutes at 350 to 400 degrees.

For the gravy, fry diced bacon and add the leftover flour mixture to the drippings (amount depends on how thick you like your gravy). Cook and stir over low to medium heat, making sure the mixture is smooth. Add heavy cream and Tabasco sauce to taste. Serve over mashed potatoes and/or dip your fried chicken in the goodness.
