The success of both companies provides much-needed employment for residents in the Columbia River Gorge.

"They represent the fulfillment of the port's longstanding vision to bring good-paying jobs to our community to support our local economy," said Jess Groves, president of the port commission.

Both businesses will also contribute to the tax base for the City of Cascade Locks.

"It will increases the tax base ... it got to a point where Skamania County was saying we're not coming over, we're helping you too much, and you're not helping us," said former Cascade Locks Mayor Tom Cramblett. "But we have turned that around and part of what turned that around is things like this - it gave us a new tax base."

Numerous people worked to bring the project to fruition.

"We thank the governor (Oregon Gov. Kate Brown) for writing the \$2.4 million into her budget for the expansion of the business park and Oregon Sen. Chuck Thomsen, who stays on top of Cascade Locks' issues and has been really good to Cascade Locks," Kaganova said.

More governmental officials helped the port with financing of the new Renewal Workshop building.

"We're really appreciative

of what those senators have done for us, including Rep. Anna Williams for all of her efforts supporting this project, Business Oregon, pFriem Family Brewers, and The Renewal Workshop, JH Kelly (contractor), and many others," she said.

The community benefits from the business development, Groves said.

"This is what I call a winwin for our community," he said. "This is our sixth building in about seven years ... which was a big undertaking."

Nicole Bassett, co-owner of The Renewal Workshop, said the new site means the company can consolidate its operations which are currently being conducted out of several other port buildings.

"This is really special to be able to access that land and be able to grow business on it and do something really that has been my vision and dream and to see it like, this is incredible," she said.

The City of Cascade Locks and the port cooperated on developing the needed infrastructure for the new buildings.

The city's electrical and water systems were upgraded to accommodate the industrial expansion. The latter was especially important because it provides the necessary water supply to fight potential fires.

"We're just talking with some of the officials this morning and we actually can't imagine how we were able to run our business for that long without having a facility like this in a place like this," said Rudy Kellner, co-owner of pFriem Family Brewers. "We've been (among) the most impacted businesses and industries during the pandem-

pFriem had to lay off workers in response to the CO-VID-19 pandemic, and their revenues fell off, he said. But the pandemic also prompted the company to speed up its expansion plans.

"On March 16 last year, we were down to 30 employees," Kellner said. "And now, we have 82. We were able to rehire more than 50 folks in the last six months, largely due to having this facility available, having this space to grow, and having the infrastructure and the support from the great team here at Cascade Locks," Kellner said.

pFriem Family Brewers is also dedicated to being locally based in their beer supply.

"Seventy percent of our beer is sold in Oregon," he said. "The rest of the beer is sold in Washington across the river. We're a small regional company but we're now the third-largest independent craft brewer in Oregon."

Kellner said he believes the city and port as well as the brewery will benefit from the expansion.

"Now with this business, it's been a beautiful thing and it's just been essential for us to have this great partnership with the port," he said. "We feel so welcome in Cascade Locks from our work with city management and Gordon's (City Manager Gordon Zimmerman) team to the port. It's just been really pleasant and it's been a really positive relationship and we're just getting started."

Just opening in the business park, pFriem already has expansion plans to add 7,500 square feet to the facility.

All parties involved pFriem, The Renewal Workshop, the Port of Cascade Locks and the City of Cascade Locks – expect the new businesses will positively impact Cascade Locks for years to
