

# Council unanimously approves 'PROS' initiative

The Sunnyside City Council meeting on Monday, Feb. 14 reviewed a plan on the Parks, Recreation & Open Space (PROS) initiative with a passing resolution of 7-0 by city council members.

According to a document submitted by Jamison Horner, the Interim Finance and Administrative Services Director for Sunnyside, this plan would "...provide a framework that will allow the city to respond to new opportunities as they arise, and to ensure that parks, facilities, and recreation programs meet the needs of Sunnyside's residents, employees and visitors now and into the future."

For the next six years, Sunnyside plans to boost community engagement with large open spaces for better collaboration within Sunnyside and surrounding areas bringing in safer biking, jogging, and walking trails.

This attracts local attention but also regional attention for those who come to Sunnyside to enjoy the new improvements, considering their plan is to provide "... high quality, communitydriven parks, trails, open spaces, and recreational opportunities," as reported by the document submitted by Horner.

City Council is eager to act upon this plan to improve parks and recreation, "I am very happy to see this, I want to see this move forward and I applaud the work that has been done," Mayor Broersma said.

### Sixth Street project set to begin May 2022

The City of Sunnyside held a public information meeting Wednesday, Feb. 16 on the proposed upgrades to Sixth Street between Decatur and North Avenues. The meeting began at 6 p.m. at the Sunnyside Fire Station on Eighth Street. Area business owners including David Swails of Valley Auto Parts, and Gary Johnson of Johnson Foods attended the meeting to voice their concerns with proposed changes. Brittany Byma, owner of Complete Wellness, also attended the

meeting voicing parking concerns in the area.

The city received federal and other funding that will cover more than \$3.3 million for the roughly \$4 million project.

# Community creates superintendent job brochure

Consultants Bill Jordan and Sergio Hernandez from Northwest Leadership Associates led the discussion about the findings from the recent school and community forums during the Sunnyside School Board Work Session, Wednesday Feb. 16.

"The comments made in both community focus groups were very similar," said Jordan.

Community member

comments focused on the need for diversity, fairness, being unified and good communication.

"Our focus during tonight's board meeting was the creation of an online brochure describing the open superintendent position," Sunnyside School Board President Sandra Linde said.

The comments from the all the group meetings and online survey were summarized by Jordan and Hernandez and are a part of the new superintendent job posting brochure.

This brochure lists professional and personal qualifications that are expected of a superintendent candidate. It also lists some of the school key points that community wants to develop in the district.

The superintendent position is now open. Potential applicants are encouraged to apply before March 31 to receive full consideration.

Along with their resume they are expected to have

at least four letters of recommendation. As well as a written statement explaining how they plan to address the challenges and opportunities noted in the brochure.

The next Sunnyside School Board regular meeting will be Thursday, Feb. 24 at 6:30 p.m.

The meeting has moved to the Sunnyside High School Media Center to help with the audio difficulties for the online viewers.
