

Public Transportation

King County Metro Transit

http://metro.kingcounty.gov/

Metro Transit is the local transit operator for King County, providing local bus services that link destinations within the community and providing regional connections at the downtown Auburn Transit Center and the Auburn 15th ST NW Park & Ride. Metro Transit has more than 10 bus routes serving Auburn, including some DART routes. Two transit routes have teamed up to provide Auburn residents and visitors access to some of Auburn's most popular destinations. Metro routes 910 and 917 provide service to the Auburn SuperMall, YMCA, Auburn Library, Auburn Senior Center, Downtown Auburn, and the North Auburn **Business** District.

DART

DART (Dial-A-Ride Transit) offers variable routing in some areas within King County. By using vans that can go off regular routes to pick up and drop off passengers within a defined service area, DART service may allow you to arrange for transit service closer to a location. DART does not go door-todoor. It operates on a fixed schedule, but one that has more flexibility than regular Metro Transit buses. The cost for DART service is the same as regular bus rides on Metro and is available to everyone. To use DART, call toll-free 1-866-261-DART(3278) or 1-800-246-1646 (TTY).

ACCESS

Metro Transit also operates ACCESS Transportation, a paratransit service providing door-to-door, shared-ride van transportation within most of King County. The Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) requires curb-tocurb paratransit service as a safety net for persons whose disabilities prevent use of accessible non-commuter, fixedroute bus service. Complementary paratransit service is intended to offer a comparable level of service to that provided by regular bus service.



SOUND TRANSIT (SOUNDER TRAIN)

Sound Transit operates the Sounder commuter rail service on the Tacoma-Seattle route via the BNSF Railway. Sound Transit provides weekday peakhour trips northbound to Seattle in the AM and southbound to Tacoma in the PM. Additional special-event service to and from games for the Mariners, Seahawks and Sounders FC is offered on selected weekends. Nine trains operate in each direction between Tacoma and Seattle each weekday, completing the commuter rail service specified in Sound Move, Sound Transit's Phase I investment package.

Secret sandwich `ghost kitchen' sneaks into Auburn

From 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. Tuesdays through Saturdays, the secret sandwich "ghost kitchen" can be found inside Vinifera Wine Bar & Bistro in downtown Auburn.

It's an idea that started as a creative adaptation to pandemic restrictions and a way to keep her business afloat.

When indoor dining was put on hold in the state, Karlson and her staff realized the more upscale food that Vinifera typically produced did not travel very well for customers who could now only be served through pick-up and delivery. That is when she came up with the idea to pivot toward selling sandwiches, soups and salads. This is how Smuggler's Deli was born.

Karlson said the name "Smuggler's Deli" was intended to play off the pandemic restrictions and to make customers feel like they were taking part in something "sneaky," like drinking in a speakeasy during the prohibition era of the 1920s.

The menu carries that theme even further with sandwiches that are named after famous gangsters, smugglers and criminals from history.

Karlson pitched the idea to her kitchen staff. Head Chef Mondo Takahashi and Sous Chef Shawn Saucier were eager to start something new and be proactive to adapt to a food service industry that had almost fully pivoted to take-out and delivery. "As a chef right now, you have to be adaptable," said Takahashi.

Eventually, the deli became a hit. Many people came to try the new menu and to support Vinifera, according to Karlson. With the only marketing or signage being done digitally, she said most of their traction was gained via word of mouth.

The Smuggler's Deli uses the tagline "snitches get sandwiches," a joke that rings true for many who have spilled the beans on the hidden deli that has become one of Auburn's worst kept secrets. Local Dining, with dishes from around the world!

Auburn's poet laureate James Rodgers

April is National Poetry Month, but Auburn's Poet Laureate, James Rodgers, hopes the community's excitement and enthusiasm for poetry extends to all the other months of the year.

Rodgers said his job as Auburn's poet laureate is to represent the community through poetry and to broadly promote poetry as a meaningful creative outlet and form of expression.

He said poetry includes a variety of styles and genres that a lot of folks may be unfamiliar with.

"There is a whole lot of poetry that I love," Rodgers said. "Some of it is not for me, and that's okay."


Part of his job, according to him, is to get as many "eyeballs" on poetry in the community that he possibly can, so people can find the kind of poetry that speaks to them.

Rodgers said that as an artform, poetry allows people to escape if only for a moment, but at the same time, poetry can be a way for people to reflect on their difficult reality and deal with it head-on.

He said in trying times the past year with the pandemic and protests, poetry and art can be an important part of coping, reflecting and healing. Rodgers said after the presidential inauguration in January 2021, it was not the performances of the musicians that people remembered, but rather the "heart-wrenching" poem written and spoken by Youth Poet Laureate Amanda Gordon.

On the third Thursday of every month, SoulFood CoffeeHouse in Redmond, Washington, is home to SoulFood Poetry Night, an evening of engaged and engaging poetry that Rodgers has participated in.

Last April, Auburn held a Youth Poetry Contest, in which kids around the community or their parents can submitted poems.



Rodgers picked his favorite poems, and they were featured in the Auburn Reporter.

He said he hopes that "spotlighting" some of the poetry in the community will help to inspire more interest in poetry among young people in town.



New art on display in galleries across Auburn
